## **Expatriates call Shenzhen home**

ALL the foreigners in the city make Shenzhen their home, said Jeffrey S. Lehman, at Saturday's meeting with Shenzhen Party Chief Wang Rong.

Wang met with Lehman, who is chancellor and founding dean of Beijing University School of Transnational Law, and some other foreign professionals in the city, before the New Year Concert at Shenzhen Concert Hall on Saturday.

"Shenzhen is one of the most exciting cities in the world and it is a symbol of progress and a symbol of the future of China in the global society," said Lehman.

"What is more remarkable is the warmth and friendship the city shows to us. We feel a sense of gratitude and loyalty to the city," said Lehman, who pledged to make contributions to Shenzhen's development.

In response, Wang sent New Year greetings to expats.

"2011 was an important year for Shenzhen, in which the city's GDP exceeded 1 trillion yuan (US\$158 billion) and successfully held the 2011 Summer Universiade," said Wang.

"In the New Year, Shenzhen will continue to work toward becoming an international city. I hope more foreigners will come to work and live in Shenzhen," said Wang.

Shenzhen will push forward its international economic and cultural exchanges in the New Year, according to Wang.

Foreign professionals at Saturday's meeting also included Richard Jackson, president of Shenzhen Development Bank.

Last month, Lehman and Jackson were accredited high-end professionals under the Peacock Plan of the Shenzhen government, which seeks to attract high-quality individuals and teams from home and abroad.

Saturday's New Year Concert included performance by Lang Lang, a world-renowned Chinese pianist.

Lang was appointed Shenzhen's international ambassador Saturday and will help promote the city's international exchanges and cooperation.

There are 630 companies and institutions in Shenzhen which employ foreign experts, a 24 percent increase over 2009, according to Shenzhen Administration of Foreign Experts' Affairs.

There has been an increase in the demand for foreign experts by the city's electronics, telecommunication, aviation and freight transport industries.
